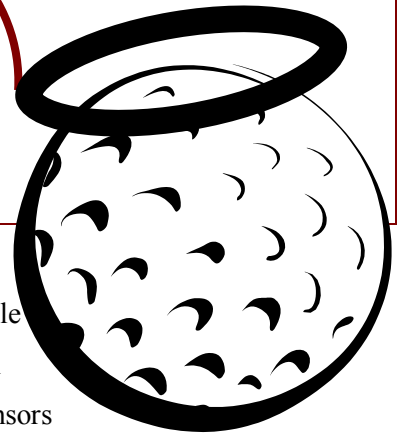


## WE'RE MOVING OUR GOLF TOURNAMENT TO IRONDEQUOIT COUNTRY CLUB!

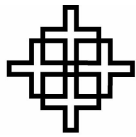
Of course, there are levels of sponsorship available and you are welcome to join our Galaxy of Stars, our sponsors at every level!

**Meeting Our Board: *Laura Maas-Community Member***

**Tell us about your educational background and work experience, including your current position.** I have a Bachelors degree in Elementary Education and a Masters degree in Special Education, both from Northeastern Illinois University. I have applied my degrees to career choices and have worked to find employment for the blind and high school children with disabilities entering the "real word" and employment. For the past 22 years I have worked with NYS Office of Adult Career and Continuing Education Services (ACCES), formerly VESID, educating the public regarding interacting with individuals with disabilities and helping those individuals enter or re-enter the work force.



**Do the needs of any particular disability group impress you as being personally or professionally compelling?** All individuals with disabilities have their own unique needs and challenges, so no two situations are ever the same. As an ACCES employee I work with all disabilities except legal blindness.

**Did you have experience with any of our clients and now that you are on the board, how would you handle interaction with a client of the agency in your professional capacity at NYS Office of ACCES-VR?** Yes, I have some experience with agency clients through our office, but, because of confidentiality, unless the client brought it up, I would not indicate that I was aware of the connection.

**What other community involvement do you have?** I am a board member of the Job Service Employer Committee (JSEC) and the past chairperson and current member of the Rochester Area Employment Network (RAEN). I am also the past chairperson for the Special Needs Committee at Temple Sinai.

**What ever led you to accept the invitation to join our board?** A friend presented the opportunity and, because of my interest and work experience with individuals with disabilities, I support what Catholic Charities Community Services does.

**Everyone thinks Catholic Charities is only "Catholic". Do you agree with that assumption?** I did, until I became involved with the board. Now I realize that the agency serves all, employs all and accepts volunteers from all faiths.

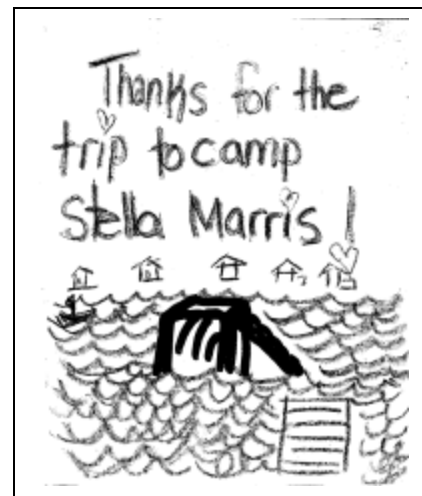
